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CCSM Policies

PAYMENTS AND FEES

Registration Fee

A one-time \$20 registration fee is applied to the account of each new student. Returning students will not incur a registration fee.

Late Fee

Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to a student's account for past due balances.

Payment Methods Accepted

We accept cash, check or credit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express). Please note that a 3% convenience fee will be applied to all credit card payments. Direct bank account payments or ACH payments are also accepted and incur a 0.8 percent convenience fee.

CANCELLED CLASSES / WORKSHOPS / ENSEMBLES

CCSM reserves the right to cancel group classes if enrollment does not meet the required minimum number of students. In the event a class is cancelled, the parent/student will be contacted and a full refund of all fees will be issued.

STUDENT MISSED LESSON

Out of courtesy, students should notify the instructor of any absence for any reason. However, this does not exempt the student from payment. There will be no makeup lessons for private instruction or classes for student absences. CCSM is committed to pay the teacher for the time you have scheduled; therefore, this policy is strictly enforced. If you anticipate a prolonged absence of more than 2 weeks, contact the CCSM office. With instructor approval we may adjust your account.

INSTRUCTOR MISSED LESSON

If an instructor is absent, a makeup lesson will be scheduled at a mutually convenient time. Scheduled makeup lessons missed by the student will not be made up.

WITHDRAWAL & REFUND POLICY

Private Instruction

The office must be informed of withdrawals by the parent/adult student in writing. Verbal notice is not accepted. Refunds will be considered by the Executive Director OR CCSM Board Treasurer on a case by case basis. Registration and late fees are nonrefundable.

Group Classes/Workshop/Ensembles

No refunds will be considered after the 1st class meeting.

LIABILITY

Upon receipt of tuition payment, parents or legal guardians agree that CCSM shall in no manner be liable for any accident, injury, loss, theft, or damage which may be sustained on the premises in conjunction with any school related activity or function.

Private Lessons

Private Lessons

Private lessons are open to new and continuing students. For new students, registration begins with advisement in the student's area of interest followed by an instructor placement. All lesson arrangements for new and continuing students are made directly with their instructor. Private lessons are available on most instruments. Suzuki instruction is available for piano, violin, and cello.

Private lesson students joining CCSM for the first time register for the full academic year and will have a one month trial period. If a student chooses to withdraw prior to the 4th lesson taught, a full refund will be given minus the cost of the initial given lessons. It is expected that students will commit to weekly lessons for the remainder of the school year after the trial period has concluded.

Full term enrollment is required and pro-rated based on week of entry. Tuition payments are due on the 1st of the month (for the forthcoming month), billed September - May. A one-time \$20 student registration fee is applied to each new student account. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to student's account for past due balances.

Group Class - Orff Schulwerk

ORFF SCHULWERK - CHILD AGES 4 - 5 + CAREGIVER

This class is a great step towards preparing students for piano or individual instrument instruction! The Orff Approach is a developmental approach that combines music, movement, drama, and speech into lessons that are similar to a child's world of play. It uses very rudimentary forms of everyday activity for the purpose of music creation by music students. The Orff Approach is a "child-centered way of learning" music education that treats music as a language addressing challenging concepts through a gentle and friendly approach. Instruments include miniature xylophones, marimbas, glockenspiels, and metallophones, different sized drums, and (non-pitched) percussion instruments. The Orff approach also requires that children sing, chant, clap, dance, pat, and snap fingers along to melodies and rhythms.

MUSICAL THEATRE 1, INTRODUCTION TO MUSICAL THEATRE - AGES 7-11

STEM PROGRAM (STRING THEORY/ENSEMBLE/MASTERCLASS)

The STEM Program combines the study of String Theory, Ensemble, and Masterclasses to aid advancing violin students prepare for the challenges that lay ahead as their musicianship develops.

In the STEM Program, students are placed in small groups according to their advancement level. The **STEM A group (Friday at 7:00p.m.)** advancement is for the student who is at the CM Level 4-7, JMF Concerto Level IB-II, or JMF Solo Level Medium Class II-Difficult Class I. The **STEM B group (Saturday at 4:30p.m.)** is for less advanced students who are participating at the CM Level 3, JMF Concerto Level IA or IB, or JMF Solo Level Elementary Class II-Medium Class I. The levels are guidelines to the advancement of the student; the student can participate in the STEM Program without participating in the CM or JMF evaluation programs.

New this year is the addition of 3 ensemble sessions added in April and May. For most of the sessions, students will have 2 subjects addressed at each meeting, focusing on theory and performance in a masterclass setting. This will help the student learn performance etiquette and how to manage nerves, important aspects in the training of any violinist. This program is a must for all intermediate and advanced students.
